DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Breidenhart is a rambling castelated house, set on 10 acres of landscaped ground in the residential section of Moorestown, New Jersey. Built in 1894, the 2 1/2 story house has a Queen Anne plan, laid up in Romanesque rockface stone. The ground floor is dominated by a huge central living hall, which has a polygonal corner turret and rear polygonal library on the west, and a protruding irregularly shaped dining room and service wing on the east. The 2 story service wing shoots away from the main block of the house at 45 degrees. Although the main facade faces south, the principal entrance is on the west through the corner turret. There is also a side carriage port. At one time the second floor had a bedroom above each of the ground floor spaces, but many of these have been subdivided. The third floor occurs under a wide and generous garret with three full stories in the corner turret.

In the 1920's Eldridge Johnson added a rear solarium with an access passage and a bedroom with a rear balcony on the second floor.

Most of the interior woodwork is the result of Johnson's remodeling efforts. The living hall has built-in bookshelves, raised paneling, and a Jacobean fireplace. The room's most notable feature is the elaborate plaster ceiling of Elizabethan strap work with inscribed rosettes and patera. The dining room has the most elaborate paneling in the house with carved pointed arches resting upon engaged columns. The brick fireplace is set within an eliptical niche. The rear library also has raised paneling with shallow niches surmounted by carved strapwork. The diminutive half pace stair is distinguished by a carved lion which rests upon the newel post.

The wildly undulating exterior has a thin pastry-like quality despite the rockface stonework. The corner turret has a crenellated top and a side entrance under a gable. The room above the living hall is lit by a huge oriel window which occurs next to the turret. All other windows are set within the stone walls with casements and leaded panes. Most of the major rooms have fireplaces. These are all serviced by two major flues which emerge from the pitched roof near the center of the main facade, in a pair of massive chimneys. The roof covering is tile.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

8 SIGNIFICANCE

Breidenhart was owned by 2 men who became important both as inventors and as tycoons. Samuel L. Allen developed and produced the "Flexible Flyer" steerable sled. Eldridge R. Johnson, founder of the Victor Talking Machine Company, built a business empire which dominated the American Phonograph and record industry for nearly 30 years.

Walter Smedley was a notable architect of his generation. His design for Breidenhart is an excellent example of the late 19th century rural mansion. It represents a major direction taken by the Queen Anne style, an increasingly medievalizing trend which led ultimately to the more correct manoral residences of the 1920's.

In 1894 Samuel Leeds Allen commissioned the architect Walter Smedley to design his new residence in Moorestown, which he christened "Breidenhart" or broad hearth stone.

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Charles Miller, who helped plan Fairmont Park in Philadelphia, acted as consultant in the laying out and planting gardens.

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BREIDENHART (2)

Born in 1841, Samuel Allen enjoyed a varied and successful career as a farmer, inventor, and manufacturer. In 1871 he formed S. L. Allen and Co., a firm which manufactured farm equipment. Chief among its products were implements which Allen had developed himself, notably a fertilizer drill and a seed drill. Allen is perhaps best remembered for his invention of the "Flexible Flyer" steerable sled, which he patented in 1889. Sales were slow at first, but by Christmas 1915, Allen was reporting sales of 2000 sleds per day.

After Allen's death in 1918, Breidenhart was sold to Eldridge Reeves Johnson (1867-1945), founder and president of the Victor Talking Machine Co. of Camden, New Jersey. Johnson began his career as a machinist, and by 1894 he had gained control of the former John Scull machine shop in Camden. His manufacturing capability increased, while simultaneously he worked on improving the gramophone. Through shrewd business alliance, he gained control of every major patent relating to production and improvement of disc playing phonographs. After a series of court battles, which ended in 1901, the Victor Talking Machine Co. was formed. Johnson manufactured the "Victroler" under his famous trademark showing a fox terrier listening to a phonograph, with the caption "His Masters Voice."

During the early years of this century, Johnson instituted a policy to establish Victor as the nation's most prestigious record company. Europe's most famous musicians and vocalists were brought to Camden and paid enormous sums to help Johnson produce his "Red Seal" record series. The most notable of these was Enrico Caruso who made many records with Victor. The albums were expensive and elaborately packaged in leather folders. But they gained instant and lasting success. Under Johnson's leadership, Victor dominated the American record industry for much of the first third of the 20th century.

Johnson was at the height of his success when he purchased Breidenhart. He made a number of modifications which have already been described. Johnson commissioned Herman Dleiner, a locally important sculptor, to carve the new paneling. Johnson continued to live at Breidenhart until his death in 1945. Mrs. Johnson sold the house to the Lutheran Home of New Jersey in 1947 for \$30,000.




