DESCRIPTION:

Esselman Brothers General Store is located on a corner lot in the crossroads community of Mayhew Lake in northwestern Benton County. The store, along with Annunciation Catholic Church, is the central focus of this small community with an estimated population of thirty.

The 1897 store is a rectangular two story gable-roofed structure sheathed in clapboard painted green. Two single story additions flank the structure on either side. Although both additions are presently used for storage, the east addition, with a central entrance flanked by double-hung windows, originally housed three rooms of the family's living quarters. Double-hung windows are situated on all sides of the structure with small evenly-spaced windows located near the roof line on the sides.

The front facade features a recessed central doorway, large glass windows, and a false front above each of the additions. A concrete platform, protected by a tin awning, extends across the front of the structure. The platform, erected about 1935, replaced an earlier wooden porch.

The structure has undergone minimal interior and exterior alterations. Among the original internal furnishings still intact are the counter, numerous wooden flour bins, and wall shelving.

SIGNIFICANCE:

Esselman Brothers General Store is significant primarily as a well preserved example of the multi-purpose stores erected in crossroad communities throughout Benton County during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The store is also significant for its association with German settlement in the vicinity of Mayhew Lake. As settlement expanded eastward from the Mississippi River and outward from the established railroad centers in the late nineteenth century, over a dozen crossroad communities developed in the county. Several of these communities were ethnic-oriented and most were centered around a store or church. German-speaking Catholic families first settled in the Mayhew Lake area in the 1880s, organizing a Catholic parish in 1896. Louis and Anton Esselman, brothers from Wisconsin, erected the store in 1897, in the same year the original Annunciation Church was built. Although Anton moved away a few years later, Louis operated the store for several decades. The Esselman family continues to operate the store which remains one of two landmarks in this Catholic hamlet. The store retains its identity as a utilitarian grocery-hardware store serving the needs of the surrounding agricultural community.
