The bridge replaced a predecessor covered bridge at this location which had been built in 1920 by H. W. Fiedler. It was named for the nearby community of Harris, establishe ca. 1890.

The Harris Bridge is located on gravel Harris Road just 2¹/₂ miles west of Wren, spanning Marys River near the seldom used railroad.

The bridge, built in 1936, was a replacement of the previous covered bridge, built in 1920 by H. W. Fiedler. The Harris Bridge retains its rounded portal design, and its wooden plank flooring. Features include wooden piers and narrow slit windows just below the roof line to daylight the bridge interior. The siding is board and battens style, and the roof is shingled.

Harris has been a community since 1890, bearing the name of a pioneer land owner. When the post office was established, residents petitioned for the name of Harris, but postal authorities feared confusion.might develop with near-by Harrisburg. The town was known as Elam, for Mrs. Gladys Elam, the community's first postmaster, and the name was later changed to Harris.

To get there: Take Highway 20 from Corvallis to Wren; then take Harris Road west approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the bridge. #1
