

In addition to the alterations already described, a stand-by generator was installed. This proved its worth during the 1953 ice storm when all convent Station- except The Castlewas without light and heat for hours. A parking lot was built at the north-east end of the building, and a garage erected in the rear for the company's cars and garden equipment. In the basement a kitchen was built An oil burner displaced three coal furnaces though one of these was retained for emergencies, and a 6,180terations were completed, and on May gallon oil tenk sunk in the driveway 23, 1952, the move to Jersey began. The photo below shows the chimney at the extreme left has disappeared.This was removed because worknem were not able to find and repair a leak.Though not visible in these pictures, another ohimney at the west end of the house was also removed. A COMPARISON . . . GLYNALLYN AND COMPTON WYNYATES

In some respects the two buildings are similar. Compton Wynyates is set in a richly wooded hollow in rural Warwickshire and Glynallyn's land in Convent Station resembles the old English countryside — even to its ravine. Wynyates, mainly built during the reign of Henry VIII, is party composed of materials from Fulbrocke Castle ruins. Glynallyn contains some paneling from Compton Wynyates, much stained glass from other old English homes, parts of other old houses and barns.

Both are combinations of brick, timber and stone. The architecture of each is irregular; towers here and there, gables of different heights, uneven roof lines and elaborate carved and moulded chimneys of different designs.

Compton Wynystes' Great Hall and drawing room are echoed in Glynallyn, though not similar. Compton's drawing room paneling and the carwing over the fireplace was brought from the gatehouse of Sir John Spencer at Islington. His daughter married the first Baron Compton. Glynallyn's drawing room paneling was made by W. and J. Sloans. In the walls of both "castles" are secret panels, adding to the atmosphere of romance.

While Compton Wynystes is composed entirely of old materials, Glynallyn is built mainly of material so chosen and worked that it appears mellowed with age. Compton Wynyates is bedly arranged and unlivable; the house is no longer used as a residence except for a few days during the summer. It contains only four rooms that could be classed as bedrooms and no guest rooms. In its day, Glynallyn represented all that was necessary for warmth and confort.


Compton Wynyates was built around a 57 foot square courtyard. Glynallyn has none. Ground and floor plane are dissimilar.

The old furnishings of Compton Wynystes were auctioned off after Spencer, the eighth Earl of Northampton, went into debt during a borough election in 1768. Glynallyn's furniture, too, went under the hammer after the death of the Allens.




