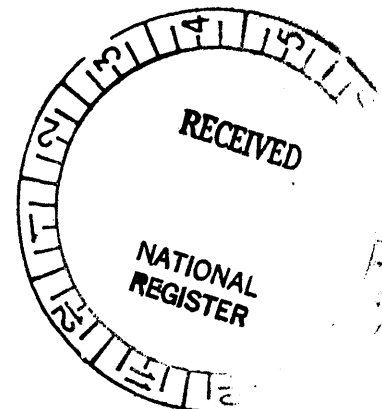

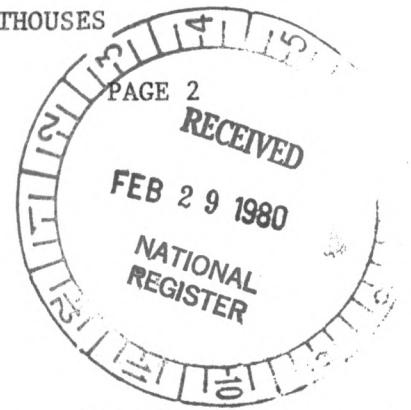
Built of brick, The exterior has since been covered with gray stucco. A mezzanine floor was added in 1965 as was a new basement, so the building has three stories. The clock tower that was added in 1888 has a curved mansard roof with the clock faces in gabled dormers. The remainder of the building has a hipped roof with a bracketed cornice. Side elevations have center gabled dormers with paired windows.

The architectural integrity of the interior has been damaged by the addition of accoustical tile and paneling throughout.



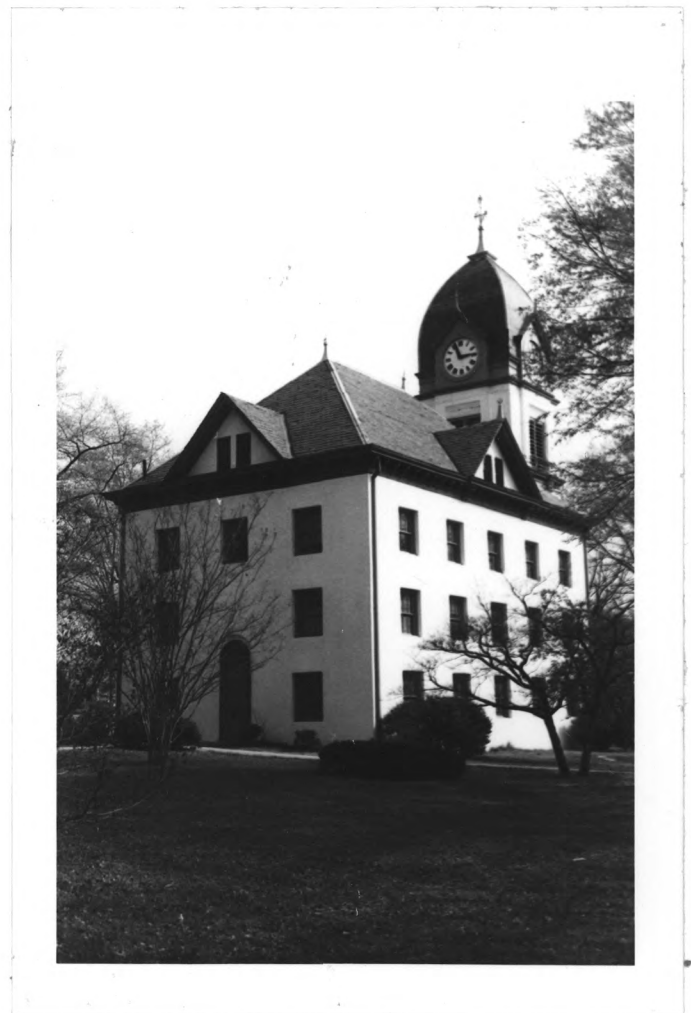
