as I can. We received thy very interesting
letter ~~and~~ last fifth day. I think Mother
will get Charlotte some thing for thee if she comes
on but I do not know what it will be.

Father & Mother have gone out to meeting
and expect to bring Aunt Margaret and
Uncle George Pryor down with them. I like
to have them they are such nice old people.
Does thee know they talk of taking the east
part of Abbeys house. Woud it be nice?

Charles Abbeys expects to come back the first
of next month. I believe Mother said that
Richard and William had rented their
house for 12th a week. is not that pretty
good rent. William wishes me to see thee
that he has five banks he bought one of
them their names are Fredo Jakey Sance
and Molly & Billy. He says I got a valentine
with a picture in one corner and a very
pretty embroidered edge; he just told me that

I made a mistake it had no picture in
the corner. This is it -
