

- DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE
- 1. Exterior of Main Building: Huddleston House is a 3 story 12 void regular brick gabled tavern with attached 2 story gabled kitchen ell of brick. The principal elevation faces the National Road. Two doors in the basement story provide access from the road front. The tavern site slopes from south to north toward the National Road. The building is 2 stories high on the rear elevation. The rear elevation is crossed by a one story veranda. It opens into an inn court yard. The kitchen ell of 2 stories has a semi-free standing outside brick chimney which rises above the roofline of the main block. It services a kitchen fireplace described in (2) below. All sash are 6 x 6 light small paned glass. The house may have had blinds. but no trace of the same can now be found. Door and window trim is simple and dignified, of no particular order.
- 2. Interior of Main Building: The basement story(which receives light from the north only) consists of 2 rooms separated by an enclosed stairway leading to the second floor. The two rooms appear to have been a tap room(to the west) and a parlour. No original bar hardware remains. The second story consists of a guest's parlour and common room(to the west) separated by the stairway. Both rooms have excellent Grecian style columnar mantels and window and door trim to match. The third floor and garret are sleeping cubicles. The kitchen is simple and contains no outstanding features other than the 6½ foot wide fireplace used for food preparation.
- 3. Dependencies: Huddleston House is one of the few 19th century Indiana road houses with any original dependencies remaining. It is the only complete inn court yard left in Indiana. A one story brick gabled milk house is southwest of the kitchen; a one story brick smoke house is south of the kitchen ell. Two barns of braced frame construction sheathed with vertical board and batten siding stand to the southeast of the main block. A one story braced frame gabled carriage shed stands to the south of the barns. The following diagram explans the inn court as it now appears:

- 1. Architectural Significance: Huddleston House is the best preserved Indiana early 19th century inn. It is a fine representative example of late Federal style commercial The dependences have somehow survived construction in Indiana. 130 years to form a group of superb inn outbuildings and a true inn court. The main building is highly articulated and functionally organized into sleeping, eating and recreational It is the best remaining example of the traditional Anglo-American inn in Indiana, if not the Midwest. inn type of the Huddleston House was to be superceded by 1845 by the Rogers-type hotel, such as Indianapolis' Bates House. The interior detailing of the main block is well-conceived and charactertistic of the late 1830's.
- 2. Historical Significance: Huddleston House was built by Jonathan Huddleston between 1838 and 1840. It was a business venture put up by one of the original proprietors of nearby Dublin. Huddleston was a businessman and inn-keeper in Dublin. The Huddleston House catered to drovers, immigrants and commercial travelers. It was located outside Dublin because it required a large yard for livestock and immigrant wagons. The Huddleston House was sold to Levi Burkett in 1847, later reconeveyd to Solomon Huddleston in 1854. Solomon passed the house to John Huddleston in 1860. It was operated as an inn long after most National Road inns had closed. It was closed before the turn of the century, and sold out of the family in It was re-opened just before Word War II as a restaurant, and remained open until 1963, when our chased by Historic Landmarsk Foundation of Indiana, Inc. (It is now undergoing restoration by Historic Landmarks Foundation.)
