14. History: John C. Kouns was an officer with the 1st Ky. Regiment and fought under Andrew Jackson in the War of 1812. He married Elizabeth Smith in 1818. He was involved in the following businesses and political offices in Greenup: owner of Kouns House, tavern (1827) ferry keeper on the Ohio River (1857), sheriff of Greenup Co. (1836-7), and state senator (1850-7). Kouns and his wife donated the land for the ME Church in 1845. The Kouns House was later owned by the Hollingsworth and Sands families.

#### 45. Description and House Plan:

The John C. Kouns House is a two-story, three-bay brick residence. It is one room deep in the main block and has a two-story brick ell. The ell was originally an open gallery along the east side, but the central part has been enclosed. A window on the first floor of the west facade has been changed to a door.

The central entrance is framed by pilasters, three-light sidelights, and a five-light transom. The windows are capped by stone lintels and are 6/6. Brick chimneys are located in the gable ends of the house. There are molded box cornices underneath the eaves with plain frieze boards and returns on the gables.

According to the Sanborn Insurance Maps for Greenup, the Kouns House had a central, single-bay porch until approximately 1929 when the present wraparound porch was built. A hairpin iron fence defines the north and west boundaries of the yard along Jefferson and Elizabeth Streets.

The porch is one story and curves around to almost cover the north and west facades of the house. The porch roof is supported by Tuscan columns and the railing has matchstick balusters.
