#### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Patterson Law Office, situated north of the courthouse square in Central City, Nebraska, is a one story, false-fronted building with gable roof. This fine, frame 19th century commercial building rests on a stone foundation and exhibits Greek Revival elements in the door, window, pilaster and cornice detailing. Some damaged exterior siding has been removed and is being stored. Upon close examination of the "false-front", one can faintly see the lettering "John Patterson Law Office." The interior of the building contains two rooms, two deep, lined with wainscot paneling. Restoration of the building is planned by the Lone Tree Literary Society, who will use the facility as a library/reading room in honor of Central City native and author Wright Morris.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

John Patterson, a native of Ireland, came to Nebraska in 1872 after receiving his Bachelor of Laws degree at the University of Wisconsin. He established his residence at Lone Tree (now Central City), Nebraska and became a pioneer member of the bar in that section of the state. Patterson built a large law practice in Merrick County and became a well-known trial lawyer and forceful public speaker. He played a very significant role in the civic, material development and progress of Central City and Merrick County. Politically, Patterson served as county superintendent of schools and county attorney. Two of his sons were later associated with him in his law practice.

Architecturally, the building is significant as one of the earliest known frame commercial buildings still extant in Nebraska. Built ca. 1872, this structure predates the majority of our 19th century commercial buildings by nearly 20 years. The simple detailing and the street-scale proportions make the Patterson office a fine example of this architectural era.
