SIGNIFICANCE	The Samuel Beach House was first recorded by the W.P.A. survey and dated 1790. The house has been researched by the Beach family who have occupied the house for several generations. The present owner Samuel W. Beach has restored the house as closely as possible to what he believes to have been the original. Architecturally, the house is representative of the full two-story, central chimney New England house as it had evolved by the end of the Second Period, 1671-1720 (Keith). It is significant in Branford's collection of eighteenth-century houses for its integrity of location, design, setting, materials and workmanship. As an example of eighteenth-century colonial architecture, it meets Criteria C of the National Register of Historic Places.
