- #706 Aztec Motor Company Building, 301 S. Main, ill. 31.
4. Owner: Robert L. Stevenson, 301 S. Main, Aztec, N.M.
7. Description: Stone foundation, common bond brick walls; original fixed store windows with transom; new door with side lights; single side door with side light; transom, splayed segmental arch with projecting cap; decorative brick work cornice.  
This building stands directly across the street from the American (Aztec) Hotel, in a commercial area one block south of the proposed Main Street District.  
The only modification appears to be the recent replacement of the recessed main entry.
8. Significance: The Aztec Motors Building is the one intact single-story commercial building in the local Decorative Brick style, a type which once accounted for half a dozen buildings on Main Street. Built about 1906, it first served as a feed store, with a livery stable attached to the south. In the 1920s, as often happened, it was converted to a car dealership. Floyd Rhodes has continued to operate this Chrysler-Plymouth dealership since the 1930s.
