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45. Description and House Plan:

This one-story, brick fire station consists of a main gable-front mass with a subsidiary cross-gabled block, containing the dual-ramp stairs to the full basement and the rest rooms, on the left (east) of the main block, which faces northwest. Classically derived detail includes brick quoins, a modillion cornice, round-arched openings with keystones and imposts, and pedimented gable-ends. Masonry trim is in smooth-dressed stone.

In the interior, all walls are tiled and all ceilings are tongue-in-groove boards. The main block, the firehouse, consists of a single large space, partitioned in the southwest corner for an office.

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
