Noteworthy chiefly as among the few "former" courthouses remaining in Iowa. Rectangular on plan with centered entry porch enclosed. . Front porch has pilastered projections which frame a narrowed front door. Possible originally had a tower of some sort. Hip roof, common bond brickwork, and stone sills beneath 2/2 windows. Segmental arched lintels are shaped into hood-like caps above each window.

This courthouse is locally significant as the historical focus of county government, and of the political power and prestige derived from the community's status as the county seat. As center of county government, an Iowa town was reasonably assured of economic and population growth, and a prominent role in local social and political life. The county courthouse represents a significant public investment in a structure built not simply for utilitarian purposes, but also as a monument associated with the historical importance of county organization and development. This courthouse was used from 1873-1876 for courthouse purposes, until county seat was moved to Logan. The building is representative of the many early contests for county seat status between newly organized communites in Iowa. The Building served as the Methodist Episcopal Church until at least 1938.
