DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Shadows-on-the-Teche was built in 1831-34 as a townhouse for David Weeks. James Bedell was the master builder. Although Weeks lived in the house only a few days before an unsuccessful trip to Connecticut to regain his health, the property was held by his descendants until 1958 when it was willed to the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Restoration since that time has brought it to a condition approximating that when new.

It is a two-and-a-half-story house of light red brick. Behind a two-story veranda with eight giant Tuscan columns, the plan is three rooms wide and two rooms deep. The end rooms are not as wide as the center and the rear rooms are not as deep as the front. The central room at the rear on each floor is an open loggia as it was originally designed, although it was enclosed on the upper story from 1860 until 1968, and on the lower during the occupancy of Weeks Hall, 1922-58.

Now furnished as a dining room, the central first floor room has a marble floor, a broad cornice, and a pillared and paneled wood mantel-piece. Other first floor rooms are floored with brick and the rooms on the west end have exposed ceiling joists, whitewashed. The upstairs drawing room has the only marble mantel and a somewhat richer cornice than the dining room below.

The exterior is distinguished by a triglyph and metope frieze continued across the gable ends. The columns, of plastered brick, rest on cubical plinths. The end bays of the colonnade are filled with dark green jalousies; those on the west screen the open stair.

Although near the center of New Iberia, the Shadows has a garden setting of two-and-a-half acres which includes great trees, a hedged formal garden to the east of the house, a tea house at the rear overlooking the Teche, and a family graveyard in the southwest corner of the property.


