Summary

The El Dorado Confederate Monument is located on the southwest corner of the lawn of the Union County Courthouse at South Washington and North Main Streets. It consists of a male uniformed Confederate soldier in mid-stride on top of a four-columned classic temple structure. Inside the temple is a fountain, which is no longer in operation. The figure, which stands 76"x28"x28", is hatted and carries a bayonetted rifle at shoulder arms in his proper right hand. His proper left foot is in partial stride to the rear and a tree form reinforces the proper right leg. A bed roll is draped from his proper left shoulder and slung under his proper right arm, and a canteen is attached to his belt on the proper left front. The structure, with dimensions of 15'x10'x10', has a two-tiered base with a cannon-shaped Ionic column at each corner rising to the inscribed lintels. The lintels are surmounted with a tiered roof decorated with a cannonball at each corner. The entire monument is made of gray/blue striated marble.

Elaboration

The El Dorado Confederate Monument is located on the southwest corner of the lawn of the Union County Courthouse at South Washington and North Main Streets. The front lintel, on the south side of the monument, is inscribed "CSA / 1861-1865 / ERECTED BY THE HENRY G. BUNN CHAPTER / UNITED DAUGHTERS OF THE CONFEDERACY / 1909."

The rear lintel, on the north side, is marked "'TRUTH CRUSHED TO EARTH SHALL

RISE AGAIN.' / 'EVEN DEATH CANNOT SEVER THE CORDS OF MEMORY.'"

The west lintel contains the inscription "'IN HONOR OF THE CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS / OF UNION COUNTY, ARK.'"
There is a pair of crossed swords on the east lintel.

Both the sculpture and the base of the monument suffer from bird guano, black crusts, and organic growth. The figure seems to have lost some detail due to prior cleaning. A 1993 SOS! survey recommends that the monument would benefit from treatment.

The El Dorado Confederate Monument is associated with the historic context "Something So Dim It Must Be Holy": Civil War Commemorative Sculpture in Arkansas, 1886-1934 as a commemorative monument financed and erected through the efforts of an ancestral organization in Arkansas. As such, it is eligible under Criterion A with statewide significance for its associations with the efforts of the Henry G. Bunn Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy to reflect members' perception of the noble character and valor of their veterans and their cause. Thus, it also meets the eligibility requirements of Criteria Consideration F: Commemorative Properties.

Elaboration

The El Dorado Confederate Monument was erected at a cost of over \$2,850 by the Henry G. Bunn Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy in honor of Union County's Confederate dead. It was dedicated on Monday March 21, 1910, as part of a ceremony that included music, prayers, and speeches, with the Hon. John H. Hineman of Arkadelphia as the featured orator. Its design is very unusual; it is believed to be the first such "memorial fountain" to be erected in the South. The Arkansas U.D.C. book Confederate Monuments and Markers in Arkansas explains the symbolism of the fountain: "the cool crystal water was intended to denote the calm steadfast purity of purpose of the sons of the South in the great war, while the freedom of the waters' flow and its' enlivening healing nature served to typify the loving stream of blood that was forced to flow ere the land of these immuned here was compelled to bow to the superior force, wealth and strength of the invader."
