### Description

Large, five-room log barn with metal-covered gable roof. Metal-roofed shed on facade is supported by square wood posts. There is an arched firebox on left elevation. Wood plank (1" x 6") door on facade and rear elevation. Foundation is brick, but has been reinforced by concrete along facade. Weatherboard has been added between logs. Gable ends are weatherboarded.

### Sich, ficance

The Meekins Barn, which is believed to have been constructed before 1935, is significant as an unusually intact example of a log tobacco barn. This method of construction was used in Marion and Dillon Counties for flue cured barns from 1890s until the 1950s.
