- 4. Owner: Lorenzo Garcia, 824 Railroad, Las Vegas, N.M.
- 7. Description: Rectangular shape, narrow side to front; stuccoed foundation over unknown material; stucco over adobe walls; wood shingle roof; moderate overhang with exposed rafters; 1/1 double-hung windows with wood surrounds, wood casement windows in dormer; single door; stuccoed porch wall, piers with caps and ogee arches. Located in a residential area two blocks north of the Railroad Avenue District.
- 8. Significance: Like the preceeding house, Building #1301, the Salazar House resembles homes on the west side of the river more than those to the east. The symmetrical Hipped Box design appeared on both sides of town, but those of the west side are of adobe (like this house), while those to the east are usually wood frame or brick. More tellingly, the porch ogee arches are a local folk decoration otherwise seen only on westside houses (and see #1607, ill. 60). Vidal Salazar (listed as driver and wife, then Elisa Salazar), appear at this address in the city directories from 1908 to 1919.
