

Statement of significance:

This bridge consists of one Pratt pony truss span, which was a commonly used type of truss span in Mississippi during the early 20th century. It is significant in that it embodies "the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction." An agreement to preserve this bridge was made in 1983 with the Lowdes County Board of Supervisors.
