





The Kirksville Christian Church is a one story rectangular frame sanctuary building with the entrance on the gable end. The front or east facade is three bay with a central doorway. The paired doors form a lancet shape. The windows to either side of the door are lancet shape with a half lancet lunette in the apex of the gable. The south and north facades are three bays formed by windows similar to those on the front. The foundation is brick. A bay window projects from the rear or west facade of the building. The roof is gable shaped with overhanging eaves upheld by wooden brackets.

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Statement of Significance

The Kirksville Christian Church is significant under criterion C for circa 1878 as an example of the Gothic Revival style with its double-lancet windows, brackets, and steeply-pitched gable roof applied to the rectangular plan of rural county churches.

Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary was chosen to preserve the church's setback from, the road (KY 595) and to provide a minimal setting for the building.

The boundary contains one contributing building.
