rear.

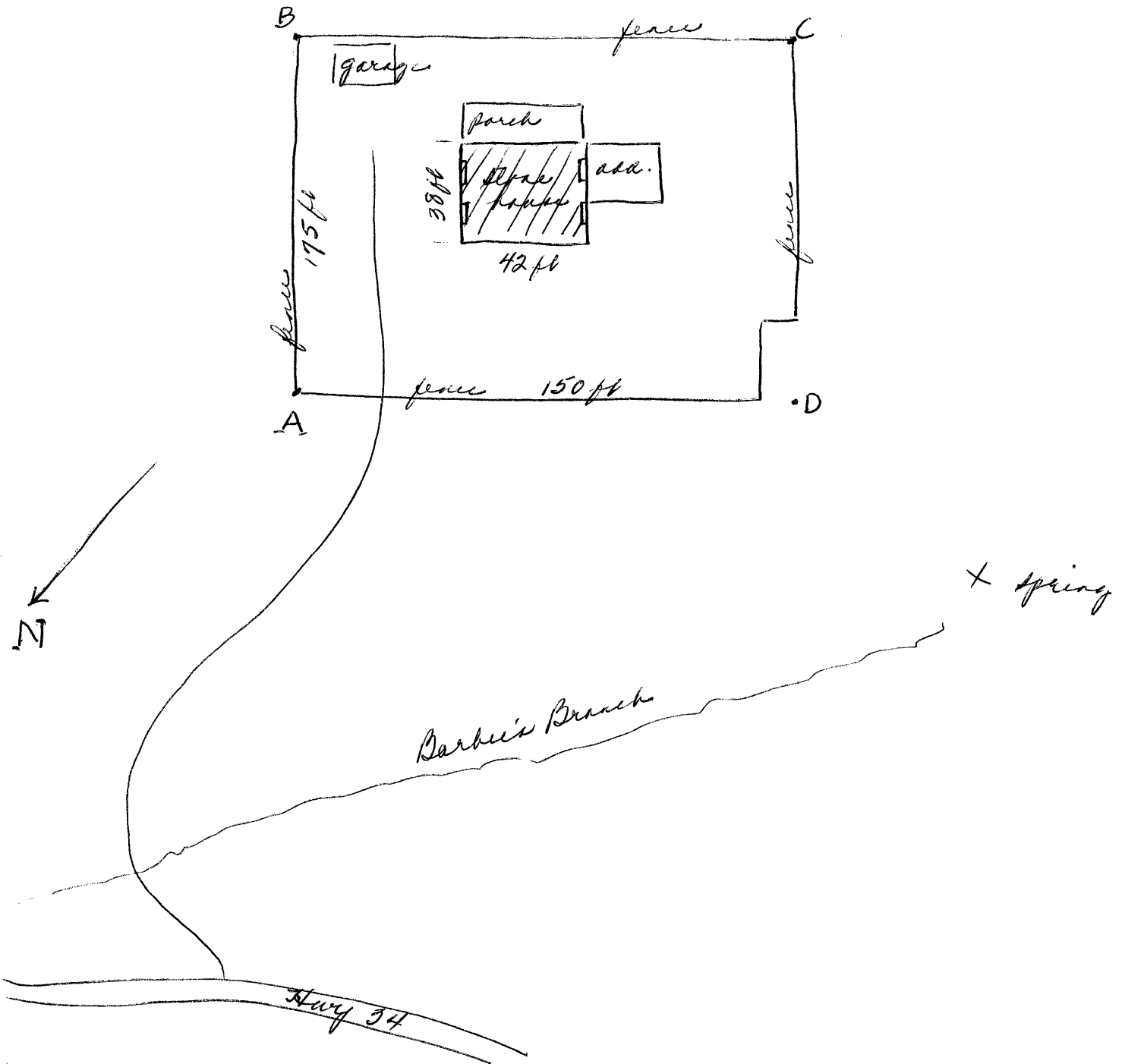
House was gutted by fire in 1960.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at a fence post in the N corner of the yard, thence <sup>w fence</sup> SE 175 ft to B, SW 150 ft to C, NW 175 ft to D, and NE 150 ft to the beginning, containing the stone house - about 2/3 acre. No other significant buildings on farm.
