

Description

The Winnetoon Jail, located in the present-day city park, Winnetoon, Knox County, is a small one-story rectangular structure. It has a gabled-roof and one door on the main facade. The walls are constructed of cement up to the plate level. The plate level itself is wood as are the shingles. This nomination consists of one contributing building, the jail.

The Winnetoon Jail is located at the northwest corner of the present-day Winnetoon city park. It is a one-story gable-roofed building that measures 8 by 10 feet. Constructed in 1907 of cement up to the plate level, the walls are approximately 8 inches thick. The plate level itself is wood as are the shingles (replaced in 1983). A brick chimney protrudes from the rear of the roof.

On each side facade is a wood-framed window that is reinforced with horizontal iron bars. A wooden outside door (replaced in 1987) shelters an interior strapped metal grill door. The metal door was made by a local blacksmith, E. Scheer, Jr. An inscription on a metal band of the door reads "Made by E. Scheer Jr., August 4, 1907, Winnetoon, Neb."

The interior is a single room that was used as the cell. The walls and floor are cement and the ceiling is iron sheeting. A wood burning stove, which has been removed, and a cot were the only furnishings. The jail is currently used as a tourist attraction in the city park.

Statement of Significance

The Winnetoon Jail, located in Winnetoon (1994 pop: 59), Knox County, is eligible at the local level under Criterion C as a good representative example of an early 20th-century jail designed for use in a small community where its use would normally be limited. The period of significance is 1907 when the jail was constructed.

Established in 1901, Winnetoon, located in the northeast region of Nebraska, never had a very large population. But in the first decade of its existence the community did grow and reached its peak population of 220 in 1910.

As Winnetoon was experiencing this moderate growth leading up to the 1910 population figure, village officials started to become more concerned with law and order in the community. In 1907, the Village Board minutes indicate a decision was made to build a jail "in order to maintain peace and good order within the Villiage (sic)." An original bid of \$45.00 was deemed too expensive and rejected. A second bid of \$37.00 was accepted and the jail was built by July 1907.

By 1930, Winnetoon's population had declined substantially due primarily to many people relocating because of the Depression. The jail, which had never held many prisoners, was used even less. The door was left unlocked unless someone was incarcerated.

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Statement of Significance (continued)

The Winnetoon Jail is significant because it represents a period in the community's history when it was experiencing enough of a population increase that the village officials thought such a facility was necessary. Since the village offices were housed in the bank there was no sheriff's office or administration building in which the jail could be located. For this reason the Village Board decided to have a free-standing structure built. There is only one other example of this building type, a single-room jail, that has been surveyed in the northeast region. The Verdell Jail (KX13-024), also located in Knox County, is in a very deteriorated condition. For these reasons the Winnetoon Jail is significant at the local level under Criterion C as an excellent example of a jail designed for a small community.

Verbal Boundary Description

Beginning at the southwest corner of Seth Jones Out Lot, Winnetoon, thence north 289 feet along Sherman Avenue, to the point of beginning, thence east 52 feet, thence north 10 feet 6 inches, thence west 54 feet, thence south 10 feet 6 inches to the point of beginning; excluding any adjacent real estate that lacks historical association or integrity.

Boundary Justification

The boundary consists of an area which includes the jail, its immediate surrounding landscape; and excludes any other adjacent real estate that lacks historical association or integrity.
