DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Located on the North Tyger River in Spartanburg County, Anderson's Mill is a one and one-half story frame structure covered by corrugated tin siding. The structure features a low gable roof, with a projecting pent roof along the north facade. Fenestration is irregular. Although a mill may have been constructed on the site either in the late 18th Century or early in the 19th Century, the uncoursed fieldstone foundation and some of the supporting joists and timbers appear to be all that remain of the earliest structure. The majority of the building materials appear to date from the late 19th or early 20th Century.

The eastern facade faces the river and features a metal water wheel, approximately 14' in diameter. This wheel is believed to be approximately fifty years old. Water from the river is diverted through the wheel by a nearby lock and canal. Power is thus generated for the milling process. A smaller water wheel is also located on the south (rear) facade of the mill.

The structure consists of a basement, main floor, and attic story. Milling machinery includes a feed mixer, self-rising mixer, scales, corn sheller, and a raised platform with a large millstone. Most of this machinery is believed to date from the early 20th Century and is in operating condition. The alterations to the structure are partially the result of the continuous operation of the mill.

SURROUNDINGS: Anderson's Mill is located in rural Spartanburg County. On the east, the mill faces the North Tyger River, while on the west it is flanked by a steep incline with large boulders. The nominated acreage consists of five acres which are of scenic value and should be preserved. Currently, the site is being used as a recreation area for the surrounding community, and picnic tables have been placed on the grounds. The present owners are appreciative of the historic and scenic value of the property and plan to maintain the mill. It is open to the public by appointment for educational purposes, as well as for limited commercial use.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Anderson's Mill is a good example of a water-powered grist mill, a once important element in the economy of 18th and 19th Century Piedmont South Carolina. Although the history of Anderson's Mill may possibly begin in the late 18th Century, the majority of the mill structure and its machinery are believed to date from the late 19th or early 20th Century. Therefore, Anderson's Mill is primarily significant as a water-powered grist mill which continues to be operated today.

It is not known when a mill was first constructed on the site of present-day Anderson's Mill. According to tradition, the mill may have originally been known as Nicholls' Mill -a mill which in 1856 was described as the location of the first court held in Spartanburg District (1785). Another theory, however, is that the mill was originally known as Tanner's Mill. Robert Mills' Atlas of 1825 indicates a Tanner's Mill in what appears to be the same location as the present-day Anderson's Mill. Spartanburg Deeds also suggest that property acquired by David Tanner in 1818 became that of W. T. Tanner in 1822, and that it was then transferred to James Anderson in 1831. In 1849, James Anderson sold property on the Tyger River to David Anderson. The Products of Industry Census's of 1850 through 1880 record Anderson's Mill on the Tyger River as operative, milling corn and wheat. In addition, Sloan and Epton's 1869 map of Spartanburg indicates Anderson's Mill at its present location.

The mill was operated commercially until 1975. Today, the present owners open the mill to the public by appointment.
