DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

St. Ann's Catholic Church of Badus, built in vernacular-Gothic style, is located on one side of a gravel road with its cemetery on the opposite side.

A simple gable roof tops the church's clean form. The white clapboard structure is marked into four bays on both the north and south facades. Simple Gothicstyle "tracery" within pointed arches is readily recognized in the window design. The main entrance is located on the west facade, with a narrow "tracery" window on either side. The main entrance is comprised of a double-panelled door with a simple transom overhead. A "blind rose window" is also located within the gable on the front facade. The only changes to this church since its construction in 1884 have been the addition of a belfry on the roof and a sacristy to the rear.

The interior is one simple continuous space, with an altar located in the apse at the western end. Other features include the simple gabled ceiling and a center aisle with rows of pews on either side. It appears that some changes have been made within the church, notably the addition of suspended ceiling and wall panelling. This work was probably done during the 1960's. The annex to the west includes a separate entrance to the sacristy.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

St. Ann's Catholic Church of Badus is significant for religious and architectural reasons. It also exemplifies the influx of European immigrants onto the western prairies of America. In this particular instance the group responsible for the building of this church had emigrated to Dakota Territory from Switzerland. The building housed the Badus Catholic community from 1884 when it was built until 1965 when it was closed. The length of this period of service makes the church important to this religious community. It also reflects the early pioneer spirit and sense of unity shown by its founders. The Badus settlement became the religious, commercial and social center for miles around. Since 1965 this church has only been used for special services during the summer months.

The church's origins began in 1878 when the Lake Badus Swiss village was founded. A group of Swiss settlers had been living in Stillwater, Minnesota, when they decided to scout out land in Dakota territory. After some investigation they decided to stake claims around a lake they came across in Lake County. They named the lake Badus, after a mountain peak near their previous home in the Swiss Alps.

Father John Brogan offered the first mass in this colony on May 20, 1880, in the schoolhouse. In 1881, Monsignor Thomas A. Flynn of Madison was given permanent charge of the parish as a mission. Shortly thereafter the congregation expanded, due to the settlement of a group of Irish settlers near the Badus settlement who were attracted by the advantages of a Catholic community. In 1884, the Church of St. Ann was built to serve the ever increasing needs of the community, at a cost of nearly \$3,000, and had a seating capacity of 275.

The present church stands as it was erected ninety-four years ago. The church and the cemetery are the only remaining reminders of what was once a thriving community and they serve as a constant reminder of the importance that most pioneering immigrant groups attached to their religion. Some guiding spirit was needed to see them through the first years of hardship on the prairies of South Dakota, and their Faith became that spiritual force.
