DESCRIPTION:

The Comstock School has grown in stages with the demand for more space. The main portion of the school is a 1909, 2-story brick structure. In 1909 only the two lower classrooms were completed. In 1910, one more classroom was finished, and in 1911 the fourth classroom was completed. The rectangular plan, with two floors above a raised basement, has a slightly bellcast hip roof. A dormer above the central entrance was once topped by a bell tower, now

First floor and basement windows are set into slightly arched openings. Second floor windows have flat openings. Raised brick belt coursing runs the perimeter of the building between the sets of the windows. The visual focus of the building is the central entrance bay and the repetition of elements on its three levels. Broad steps lead to double doors set in semi-circular arched doorway, flanked by narrow lower arched windows. The pattern is duplicated by the three central windows on the second floor. Raised brick hood molds are found on both levels. Wood framed windows, set into the open dormer gable, repeat the pattern. The gable dormer roof is slightly bellcast with return. Fish scale shingles cover the dormer

In 1929 a low, one-story brick high school wing was added off the rear of the school. While this wing does not contribute to the original structure, neither is it visually disruptive. The 1939 gymnasium addition is attached to the high school wing, well removed from the original school.

SIGNIFICANCE:

The Comstock School is typical of small-town consolidated schools in its size, growth, and decline. It is somewhat atypical in its design. The arched front doorway and windows make the Comstock School an unusual architectural example in Clay County. School District #69 consolidated in 1909, making the district the first consolidation in Clay County. Until the early 1920s, grades 1-8 were taught at Comstock. In 1921 a three-year high school program was begun, and in 1929 the High School addition was built, and the fourth high school grade was added. In 1939 the gymnasium was added. Declining enrollments led to consolidation with the Barnesville School in 1956, and the closing of the Comstock School. The Red River Valley Historical Society owns the school and has considered using the building for an educational interpretive conter.
