SUMMARY

The Ravenden Springs School is a one-story, rectangular-shaped building located at the corner of Wells Road and an unnamed street, two blocks SW of Spring Street in the Ravenden Springs community in Randolph County, Arkansas. It was built in 1941, in the Craftsman style. The Ravenden Springs School sits on a cast concrete foundation, and is crowned by a gable on hip roof which is covered in composition shingles. The walls are covered in field stone.

ELABORATION

The Ravenden Springs School is a one-story, rectangular-shaped building located at the corner of Wells Road and an unnamed street, two blocks SW of Spring Street in the Ravenden Springs community in Randolph County, Arkansas. It was built in 1941 in the Craftsman style.

The building rests on a cast concrete foundation, and is of stone construction.

The interior of the building was built with four classrooms; however, the floor plan is not intact, as the interior of the building is undergoing renovation for use as the Town Hall and Community Center. Though window panes have been replaced, the frames are original.

Side/Northwest Façade

The side façade of the building faces northeast, and is comprised of three bays. The main entrance to the building is located in the center section of the façade, and has a wood door with windows, as well as side and transom lights. There is a concrete sidewalk leading up to the school, and two concrete steps lead up to the central entrance. The entrance is covered by a one bay, hipped, central porch. The entrance is flanked on each side by two wood-framed, double-hung, six-over-six windows, as well as side lights and transom lights. There is minor wood ornamentation. A brick chimney is located on the right side of the facade.

Rear/Southwest Façade

The southeast facade of the building is comprised of five bays. All five bays contain bands of windows, with only two of the bands not currently boarded up. Between the fourth and fifth bands from the left, there is a door covered by an awning. The windows are wood-framed, double-hung, nine-over-nine. There are two chimneys in this section. One is at the left side of the building, close to the eastern front façade, and the other is centrally located in the roofline.

Side/Southeast Façade

There are three bays which comprise the side façade of the building. There are two doors in the center bay of this façade which are covered by a shed porch. One door leads into the library, and the other leads into a classroom. A bank of windows flank either side of the porch, and the windows are currently boarded up. A chimney is above the center of this facade.

Front/Northeastern Façade

The southeastern corner consists of five wood-framed, double-hung, nine-over-nine windows. The next bay is comprised of an entrance which is covered by a shed porch. Side and transom lights are present at the door. Six concrete steps lead up to the porch.

The following bay is comprised of a bank of three wood-framed, double-hung, nine-over-nine windows, and an entrance which is covered by a central, one-bay, hipped porch. Stone posts support the porch, and minimal wood ornamentation is present. As with the other door on this façade, side and transom lights are present.

The next bay of comprised of two banks of three wood-framed, double-hung, nine-over-nine windows.

The last bay of this façade is comprised of a bank of six wood-framed, double-hung, nine-over-nine windows.

Interior

The interior of the building contains four classrooms, and a library. The original floor plan is not intact, as the building is being renovated for use as the Town Hall and Community Center.

Jail

There is a small jail on the southwestern edge of the rear façade. The jail was dismantled and moved from its original location at the edge of the canyon to the school grounds approximately 50 years ago. It is currently used for storage. The jail is rectangular in plan, with one story. It is of concrete construction, with the walls covered in concrete block. The roof is flat, and covered in concrete slab. Since the jail has been on the site approximately 50 years, it is considered to be contributing to the nomination.

Integrity

The Ravenden Springs School retains good architectural integrity, and closely reflects the time of its construction in 1941. The building retains its original windows, and all of the entrances are intact. Though the interior of the building is undergoing renovation for use as the Town Hall and Community Center, the community is being sensitive to the building's architectural character.

Summary

The Ravenden Springs School is being nominated under **Criterion A** with **local significance** for association with education in Ravenden Springs and Randolph County, and **Criterion C** with **local significance** as the best example in Ravenden Springs of a Craftsman style schoolhouse.

Elaboration

The first known school in Ravenden Springs was the Case School, dating back to 1815. Classes were held in a cave on Hall's Creek, close to what is now Ravenden Springs. Run by Caleb Lindsey, this was the first free school in Arkansas.

Also known as "Dream Town," Ravenden Springs was established in 1880. A Methodist minister by the name of William Bailey had a series of dreams about a spring in the area that possessed medicinal qualities. After continually drinking water from this spring for an entire week, Bailey, who was seeking relief from a stomach problem, was remedied, and spoke highly of the powers of the spring water. The town soon flourished as a resort area. In 1889, according to *Goodspeed*, the town of Ravenden Springs consisted of "a post office, two general stores, one drug store, a first class hotel, a church, and a school house." The school building mentioned by *Goodspeed* was a one-room frame building, located north of the present Baptist Church. It was led by Professor David Hays and constructed in 1832.

In 1906, a ten room, two-story school was constructed, and in 1907, a high school was established for students from Ravenden Springs, Pocahontas, and other surrounding towns. In the fall of 1909, this two story building burned and was replaced with a larger, two-story, frame building. This larger school remained standing until it also burned in the middle of the 1939 school term. During the interim period between the 1939 fire and the construction of the new building in 1941, classes were held in local church buildings.

Built in 1941, and used until consolidation in 1974, the Ravenden Springs School is a wonderful example of a Craftsman style school house in Ravenden Springs. With its wood-framed, nine-over-nine, double-hung windows, stone construction, and hipped porches, it is the only extant Craftsman school building in Ravenden Springs. Two other buildings belonging to the school are no longer extant, as the Gymnasium was demolished, and the Home Economics Building burned. Having changed ownership many times over its history, the school was acquired by the town in 1990.

There is also a small jail at the southwestern corner of the building. The jail was dismantled and moved from its original location at the edge of the canyon to the school grounds approximately 50 years ago. It is currently used for storage. The jail is rectangular in plan, with one story. It is of concrete construction, with the walls covered in concrete block. The roof is flat, and covered in concrete slab.




