- 4. Owner: Miss Rosemarie Armijo C/O Miss Yolanda Armijo, P.O. Box 1216, Las Vegas,
- 7. Description: Asphalt shingle roof; small enclosed overhangs; recent aluminum double-hung windows (front), 2/2 double-hung windows in small recess with stone sills and segmental arch (sides); two single doors (one in bay) with transoms; incised porch posts with molding "capitals," stick railing and frieze, cut-out brackets; wooden bay with recessed panels and string courses; retaining wall with recessed, double stairs.

This random ashlar sandstone house is one of a group of houses at the edge of University Hill facing a row of institutional buildings. (See Buildings #512 and #518 for description of area.)

- 8. Significance: Built between 1882 and 1890, this is a solid example of the local Stone Vernacular. Its simple massing is enlivened by the intersection of the decorated porch and the window bay. Recessed in its front retaining wall are paired stairs. The house's place in the larger group of five is treated on the previous page.
