The main residence on the farm  
was destroyed by fire and replaced with  
the very good Colonial Revival house. The  
site has many outbuildings & barns, the  
oldest of which are: a log smoke house (photo 4)  
S of the quarters, a frame dairy with (photo 5)  
fine strap hinges on S window, a hewn (photo 6)  
frame barn Easternmost of the complex,  
and a stone walled cemetery S of the house.  
Site contains other, <sup>later</sup> very large horse barns.

Located on plateau above steep  
descent to Mock's Creek.

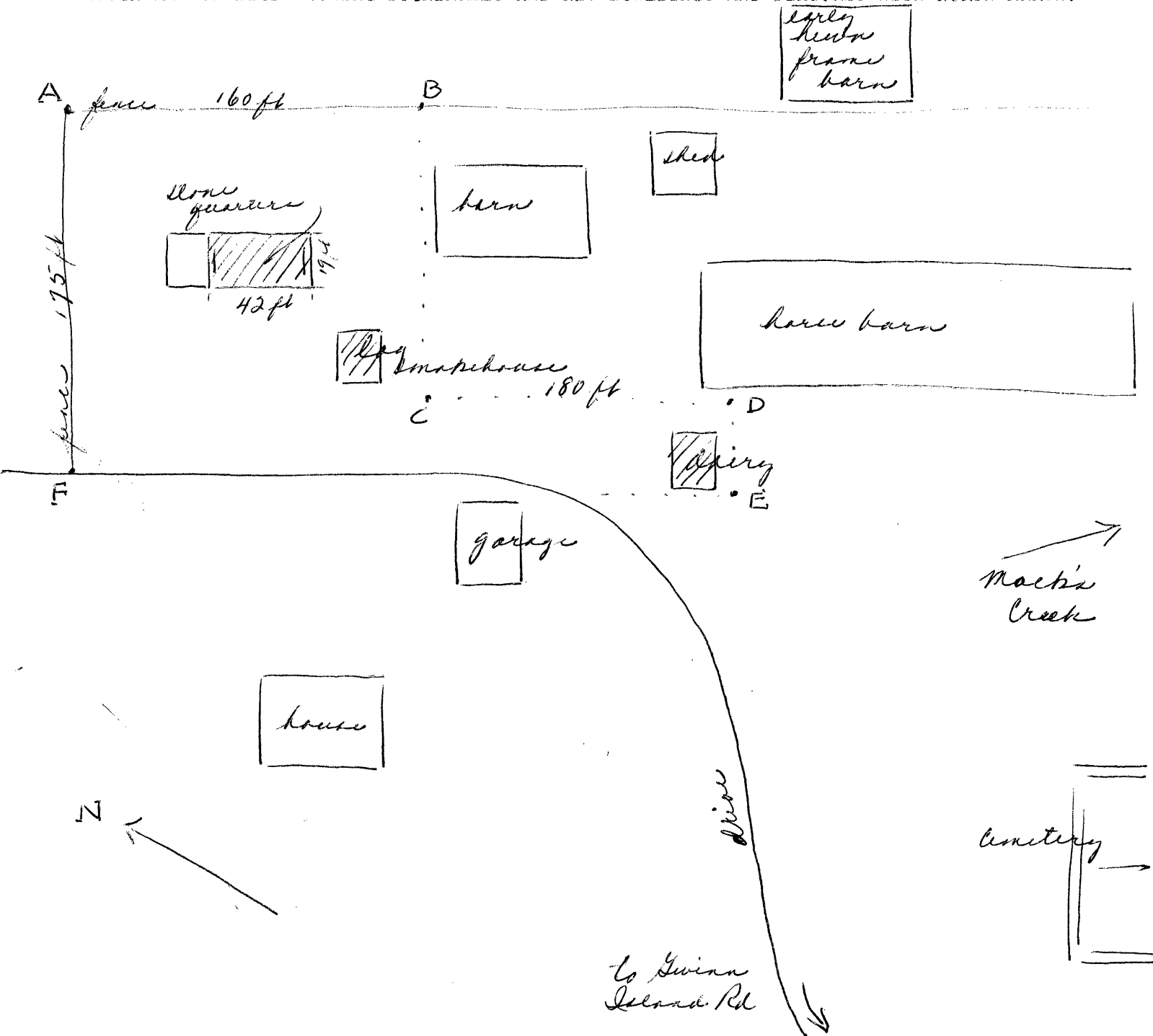
and prosperous farm; began Mock Distillery;

Present owners believe farm was always  
called Cedar Grove. Cedar trees line driveway.  
Now a horse farm.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at the NE corner of the yard around the stone quarters, thence w fence SE 160 ft to B, thence leaving the fence at right angle SW to C, a point just SW of the front of the log smoke-house, thence <sup>at right angle</sup> SE 180 ft to D, a point SE of the dairy, thence at right angle SW to E at a point SW of the dairy, thence NW parallel to A-B to the driveway and with the driveway to F, (over)

at a fence corner, thence with fence NE 175 ft  
to the beginning, containing the stone quarters,  
log smoke house and dairy - about 8/10 acre.

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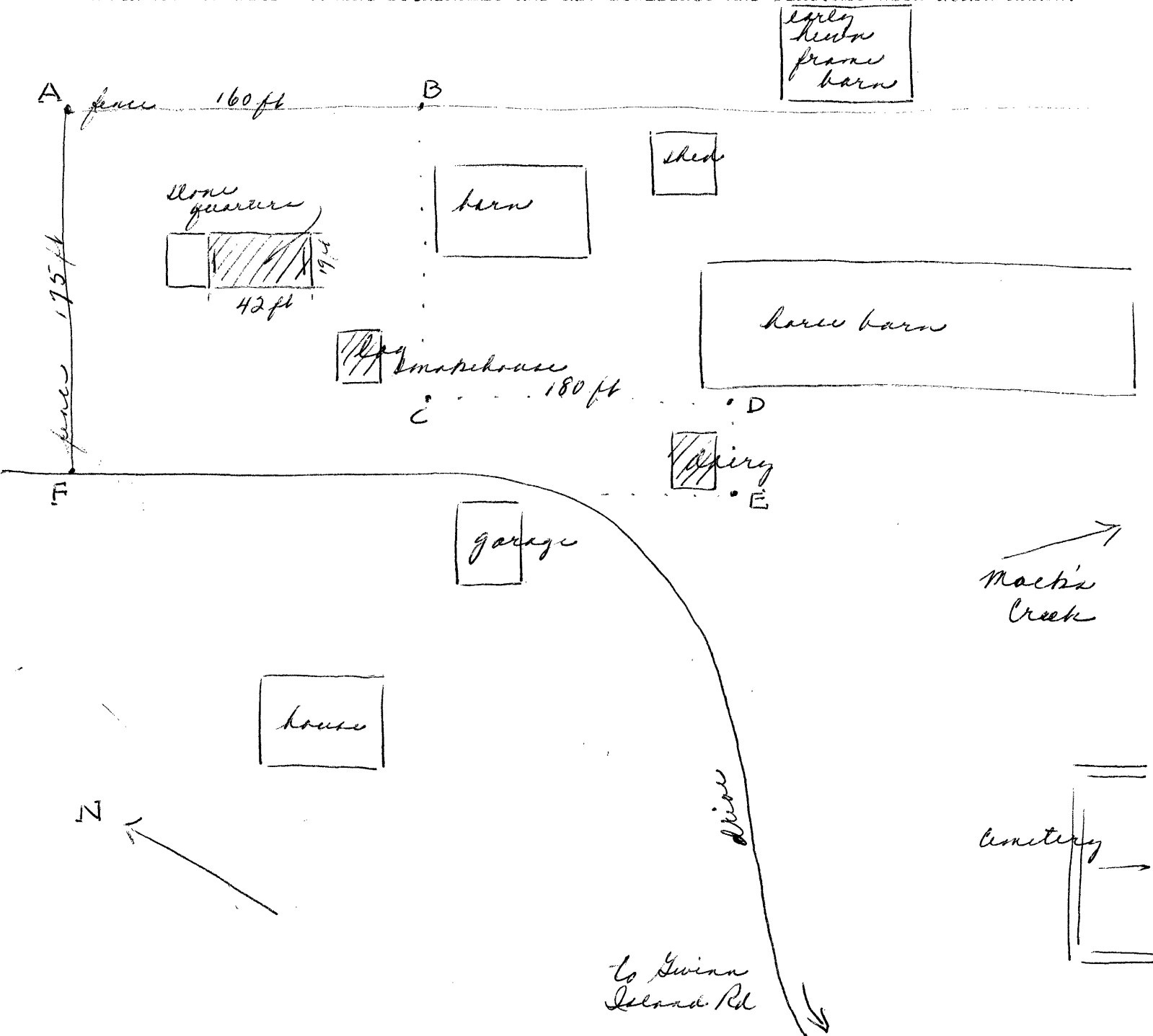
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
