19. History The dwelling was built for Robert Page ca.1896. Page originally planned to build a three-story house, but he ran out of funds. In 1914 the house and farm were acquired by Gus Shimfessel, originally from Clark County.			
20. Significance Architecture: A well-designed and well-preserved illustration of local vernacular architecture in the county. The Page House is one of the best examples

18. gable pierced by a nine-pane lancet door. Windows are 6/6 pane. Off-center ridgeline chimneys arise from the gable roof of the main block, while the ell has an interior gable-end chimney. The dwelling rests on a limestone foundation. Vergeboard trim embellish all sides of the structure. The high quality of the interior woodwork is reflected in the pedimented trim. Original wide plank hardwood floors remain intact. Associated with the dwelling are two outbuildings, a one-story frame meathouse and one and one-half story frame barn.

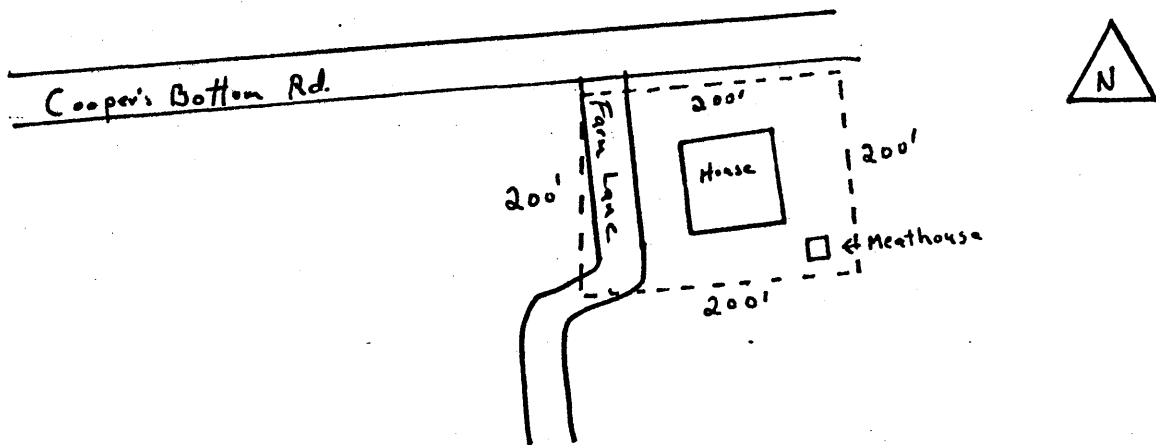

Beginning at the intersection of the farm lane and Cooper's Bottom Road proceed 200' in a northeastward direction along Cooper's Bottom Road; thence 200' in a southeastward direction; thence 200' in a southwestward direction; thence 200' in a northwestward direction along the farm lane to the point of origin.
