One of two houses constructed by the local builder Harrison Barner for his brothers-in-law Carter and Thomas Allen (see Wa-3), this house is in a sense the archetypal Warren County Greek Revival house. Features common in Greek houses in the area (I-house with two-storied ell, wooden lintels with bull's eye end blocks and rectilinear door units composed of transom and sidelights) are found here in an essentially intact structure. The interior woodwork is original.
