Description The Confederate Monument in the Owningsville Cemetery is approximately 13 feet tall. It is constructed of limestone. The pedestal has crossed guns and swords on one side and a Confederate flag on the other. The soldier standing on the pedestal is six feet tall. To the right rear of the man is a stump. The soldier is leaning on his rifle, he has a slough hat, short jacket and shoes. On the face of the pedestal is carved "The Confederate Soldiers of Bath County, KY, 1861-1865."

Statement of Significance The Confederate Monument in the Owingsville Cemetery meets National Register criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This monument was erected by the Bath County Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy after a ten year fund raising effort. It was erected as "... an honor to the men in gray and a credit to the women who made it possible." It is significant because it is a Civil War monument in Kentucky that was built before 1935 has not been severely altered and has not been moved. See registration requirements, pp. F-2 and pp. F-3 of the Multiple Property Documentation Form.

Verbal Boundary Description - The Confederate Monument whose boundaries form a circle with a radius of ten feet centered on the monument located in Owningsville Cemetery.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.
