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DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Situated at a bend of the Yazoo River, Yazoo City forms a dramatic intersection between two striking geographical formations--the vast alluvial plain of the Mississippi Delta to the northwest and the western edge of the rolling loess or bluff hills formation stretching south from the Tennessee border to Louisiana. The compact, densely developed center of Yazoo City contains over 170 architecturally significant residential, commercial, civic, and ecclesiastical structures. Proposed district boundaries have been drawn according to historical development, land-use, and topographical patterns. Viewed from the east, the residential section of the district slopes downward from Broadway (U. S. Highway 49) and Madison Street toward the Yazoo River and intersects with the Washington and Main streets civic-commercial area.

The original scale and design integrity of the town center remain intact, with a majority of commercial buildings constructed within one year of a disastrous fire which occurred in 1904. Churches, rows of two-story brick storefronts along Main Street, and civic buildings on Washington Street contrast with the shaded wood-frame houses in the older residential sectio of the district; incompatible intrusions are minimal. Intersecting civic-commercial and residential streets form a cohesive blend and establish an attractive rhythm and focus for the town center. The Yazoo County Courthouse, located at the center of the district, anchors and further unifies juxtaposing civic-commercial and residential streets.

Downtown revitalization plans for Yazoo City (population: 11,500) include an Urban Development Action grant application for improving parking facilities and streetscape amenities. The courthouse and city hall have undergone recent rehabilitation, and the Triangle Cultural Center, an adaptive-use project for the former Main Street School, is nearing completion.

Inventory of Buildings in District

Except for Main Street commercial buildings assigned dates in the entries below, all were built in 1904, after a fire had destroyed the business section of Yazoo City earlier in that year.

Street numbering in the commercial section is irregular and somewhat confusing: discrepancies exist between numbers recorded by the tax assessor's office and those appearing in the city directory; some establishments occupy more than one building but have a single address; and some numbers were apparently misassigned. At any rate local residents rely little on street numbers to locate businesses.

- 1. Ned Gotthelf Real Estate, 100 South Main Street. Two-story four-bay brick; corbeled cornice.
- 2. City Finance Co., 104 S. Main St. Two-story three-bay brick; corbeled cornice. 1905.
- 3. Ellis Building [Lawson's Barber Shop, Ellis' Department Store], 110, 112 S. Main St. Two-story seven-bay brick; cast-iron columns along storefront.
- 4. Ellis' Department Store, 116 S. Main St. Two-story four-bay brick; corbeled cornice, segmental-arch hood mold.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Yazoo City Town Center Historic District is a cohesive and architecturally significant aggregation of buildings representative in plan of a 150-year history of small-scale urban development. Approximating the area of the 1822 plat of the town, the present center of Yazoo City has retained its original civic, commercial, and residential sense of place.

The Yazoo County area of west-central Mississippi was settled after 1820 with the acquisition from the Choctaw Indians of the "New Purchase" territory. Yazoo County was formed in 1823 and the town of Benton named the county seat in 1836. A settlement known as Hannan's Bluff was established along the banks of the Yazoo River in 1824 and incorporated as the city of Manchester in 1830. Manchester was renamed Yazoo City in 1838 and was designated the new county seat in 1849. The town played a major role during the Civil War as the location of the Confederate navy yard (no longer extant) where the ironclad ram <u>Arkansas</u> was outfitted for battle during the 1863 siege of Vicksburg. In the years following the war, the Yazoo River served the town as a profitable route for packet boats transporting cotton and other produce from the Delta until the increase in rail service brought about a decline in river traffic.

Fires in 1839 and 1904 consumed most of the Yazoo City central business district. The 1904 fire destroyed 324 buildings and caused property damage of \$2,250,000. Architects A. N. Robelot and R. L. Moroney of Yazoo City prepared the drawings for the rebuilding of Main Street (Yazoo City Herald, June 17, 1904), and the reconstruction was completed in one year. Storefronts were designed in the Commercial Italianate, High Victorian Gothic, and Renaissance Revival styles, punctuated on both sides of Main Street by two Beaux Arts-inspired bank buildings.

The proliferation of large Queen Anne and Colonial Revival residences before and after the 1904 fire attests to the economic prosperity of Yazoo City at the turn of the century. The population of the town increased significantly in the early part of the present century, growing from 4,944 in 1901 to 13,500 in 1920. The architectural idiom in the residential section is thus most commonly expressed in the one- and two-story Queen Anne houses with extended gable fronts, augmented by a pleasant mixture of earlier Greek Revival and more informal ca. 1920 bungalows and cottages.

The identity of the Yazoo City town center and the merit of the historic district are furthen enhanced by locally recognized landmarks such as civic buildings, churches, and the Ricks Memorial Library (listed in the National Register of Historic Places). Author-publisher and native son Willie Morris, in an open letter to Jimmy Carter before the President's visit to the July, 1977, Yazoo City Town Meeting, wrote: "Its sense of place, Southern in soul, is impossible to isolate, but it permeates even the most casual nuance . . . There is a patina of time which envelops this ground of half hills and half Delta--the venerable continuities of time" (The Washington Star, reprinted in the Yazoo City Herald, July 21, 1977).
