
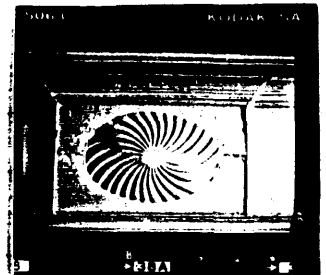

DESCRIPTION: (cont.) chairrails; transom; sidelights; N. rm. has 5 panel mantel frieze w/sunburst designs and double pilasters which are fluted; similar mantel in S. rm. w/sunburst designs in center and end panels; S. rm. also has paneled door surrounds, fluted door frames and bull's eye blocks; ell has Grk. Rev. doors w/pronounced shouldered architrave and Grk. Rev. mantel in end room. Upstairs includes Fed. mantel in N. rm. w/cupboards on either side, beveled window frames. S. rm. has Fed. mantel w/cupboards and transomed door into E. rm. Enclosed stairs w/winders on 1st floor S. rm. and middle room in ell.

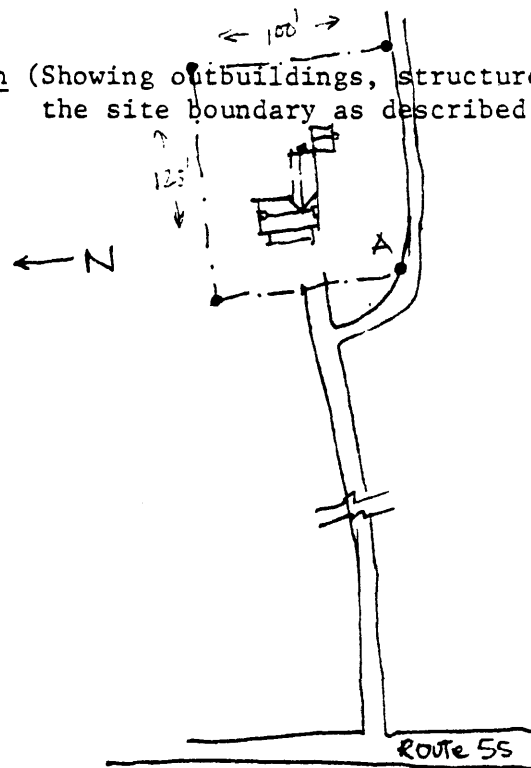

Verbal Boundary Description less than 1 acre

Point A is located 45 feet south-southeast of the southeast corner of the house. Beginning at Point A where the fence intersects the farm road, proceeding north 100 feet with a fence east of the house to Point B, thence along a fence 125 feet west to Point C, thence west with fence 100 feet to Point D, thence east with fence 125 feet to point of origin. The boundaries were chosen to encompass the house and domestic-related space as defined by fences and a drive. There are no outbuildings. The nominated area includes one contributing building.
