

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The # 4 Hogtown Voting House is situated on a large flat lot on Williamstown Road in town of Elliottsville. The voting house and precinct name is the local nickname for the town of Elliottsville. In May 1897 the lot was sold to Rowan County by James and Sarah Adkins, who had a storehouse on the lot. The deed states there was an old log school house adjacent to the lot (Deed Book 6, p. 216). In 1995 the county replaced the front door and installed a cement ramp.

The # 4 Hogtown Voting House is constructed of fieldstone and flush mortar. Exposed beams project from the original standing seam tin roof. Two over one windows are placed on the east and west elevations, with three 2' x 2' single lights located under the north gable eave. The windows have ashlar cut stone sills, but lack lintels. The three lights on the north elevation were positioned high to give light and to ensure privacy to citizens voting in three booths located under the windows. Victorian beaded boards seal the gable ends between the stone walls and roof. A capped yellow brick chimney is located at the center of the roof ridge.

NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The # 4 Hogtown Voting House meets criterion A and is a significant physical representation of the New Deal. It was constructed by the WPA and used exclusively as a voting house during the period of significance. The # 4 Hogtown Voting House has retained a majority of the original materials and is recognizable in function as a voting house. The # 4 Hogtown Voting House is located in its original setting and location, and has retained its integrity of association as a building constructed by one of the New deal era agencies.
