DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Friendship Baptist Church is a frame and stucco structure in the Spanish Colonial style. Rectangular in plan, the church contains a large square tower on its northeast corner with an espandana gable extending eastward to form the facade. The nave contains a pitched roof covered by tiles. An additional section in the rear is of two stories with a flat roof and parapet.

Distinctive features of the building include decorative molding around the main entrance and a large rose window directly above it, arched openings near the top of the tower, decorative pilasters on the exterior of the facade and nave, and stained-glass windows on both sides of the nave.

The structure is located on a street corner in a neighborhood dominated by educational buildings (Ambassadore College). A large parking lot lies directly to the east of the structure, and a small cottage, not part of the nominated property, is located directly south of the church.

There have been no major alterations to the building since its construction. The roof of most of the structure was replaced, as was much of the original electrical system. The underpinnings of the foundation have also been replaced.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

8 SIGNIFICANCE

The Friendship Baptist Church is the first and oldest Black Baptist Church in the city of Pasadena. The structure was built for a congregation of Baptists formed in 1893. The ten-member congregation originally met in a rented building and then a tent until funds were collected for the present building in 1925. In that year, the church commissioned local architect Norman F. Marsh to design the ediface which was finished in the following year.

Architecturally, the church is a good example of the Spanish Colonial architectural style which was especially popular in Southern California during the 1920's. The church tower, espadana gable, and stained-glass windows provide distinctive ornamental details which add to the character of the building, and to the streetscape of the neighborhood. The church's architect, Norman Foot Marsh (1871-1955), is known for his many excellent structures in the Pasadena area, beside his numerous designs for buildings in Venice, Fullerton, Oakland, and other areas of California.

Since the time of its formation, the Friendship Baptist Church has become the mother church for all Black Baptist churches in Pasadena, and has played a significant role in the civic and cultural affairs of the city. Today it is the oldest and one of the most important Black institutions in that city, as evidenced by its designation as a local historical landmark by the Pasadena Historical Commission.
