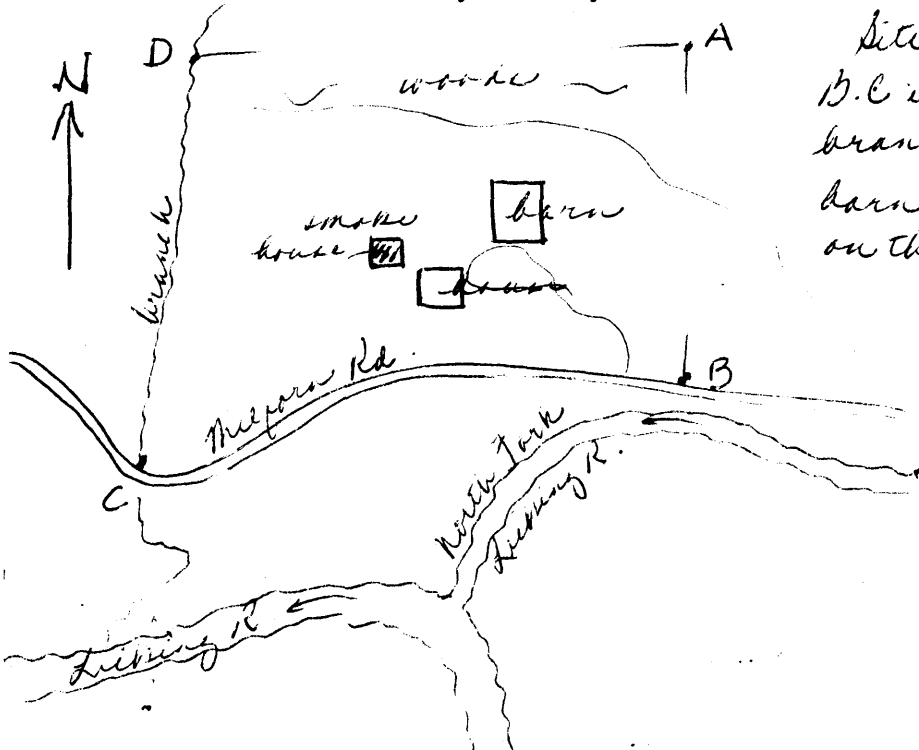

43. Site Plan and Boundary Description and Justification:



Site included by A-B-C-D as shown.  
 B-C is with the road; C-D is on a branch. The present house and barn are non-contributing, built on the old foundations.

44. Description and House Plan:

15 X 18 dry-stone smokehouse; gable roof extended on east end creates shelter for doorway. Stones squared and coursed. Walls filled with mud; no evidence of ever having had mortar and does not now. Small horizontal opening on W. end.

Present house is modern. It was built on the site of a brick Greek Revival house which was demolished by the 1957 tornado.

Both located on hilltop facing broad valley of Licking River.
