The Wade Hampton Hicks House is located at 313 West Home Avenue in Hartsville. Constructed in 1901, it is a large and intact example of Craftsman-influenced residential architecture. This house is also representative of residences in Hartsville associated with the community's industrial, commercial, and civic leaders.

This two-story residence, set upon a brick foundation, has a rectangular plan, a three-bay facade and a hip roof which reveals wide overhangs and exposed rafter tails, and is clad in asphalt shingles. A one-story hip roof porch with wide overhang, exposed rafter tails and simple balustrade wraps onto the east and west elevations and is supported by paired square wood The first floor of the symmetrical three-bay columns on brick piers. facade has two two-over-two double-hung sash windows and a central entry which features a single-leaf, fifteen-light door with a Craftsmaninfluenced surround, shelf architrave, and sidelights. The main entrance also features a historic decorative spindle-work screen door. The second story, added to the house in 1919, has three two-over-two double-hung sash windows on the north (principal) facade. There are one-story gabled ells at the east and west elevations and two interior chimneys with stuccoed caps which pierce the roofline.

A small wooden carriage house/smokehouse, also constructed ca. 1901, is to the rear and contributes to the historic character of the property.

The Wade Hampton Hicks House is significant as an intact example of Craftsman-influenced residential architecture which evolved over time and for its association with Wade Hampton Hicks (1874-1945), prominent Hartsville farmer and businessman who founded W.H. Hicks and Son Feed and Seed Company.

This house was built in 1901 as a one-story residence, but by 1919 a second story was added to accommodate the needs of Hicks's growing family. Hicks, who first worked for McKinnon and McNair Company, founded W.H. Hicks and Son Feed and Seed Company in 1922 and operated it until shortly before his death.<sup>1</sup>
