


Physical Description

This impressive two-story Colonial Revival house, faced with narrow weatherboards, on a brick foundation, is located on a corner lot in one of Little Rock's older residential neighborhoods. The Colonial Revival house with large formal portico became a staple design for expensive residences in the firm's practice. The Turner House however, incorporates several unusual features within this design framework: a gable end gambrel roof, a five bay facade, and two gable roof dormers containing round arched windows. Four monumental Ionic columns support the portico with full entablature crowned by triangular pediment. The transition from architrave to the unembellished frieze is effected by a simple molding; plain curved modillions enrich the cornice, the gable ends and the pediment. A lunette appears in the pediment as well. At the entrance, unusually fine detail is apparent in the elliptical fanlight and sidelights enriched with tracery. Above, French doors with multi-pane sidelights appear with a small balustrade of spindle balusters. The sash windows feature cornice window heads.

Statement of Significance

The Turner House at 1701 Center in Little Rock was built 1904-05. This impressively large Colonial Revival house rests in one of Little Rock's most historic residential neighborhoods. Unusual architectural features of the Turner House include a large gambrel roof, round arched dormer windows and elaborate entry marked by a fanlight and sidelights with unusual tracery. The five bay facade of the house is particularly unique to Thompson's designs. This especially large facade lends more "fineness" and authenticity to the Colonial Revival design than do the later houses designed by Thompson and his associates which combine Colonial Revival porticoes with the informality of Craftsman elements. The Turner House was severely damaged by a fire in 1981. Through the use of the original plans for this house it it being carefully restored to near original condition.
