Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The two-story rectangular (approximately 55' wide x 73' deep) church has a raised basement and is constructed of masonry and brick. Characterized by its formal composition, the building exemplifies Renaissance Revival architecture with its regular placement of fenestration, front (north) parapet, and unadorned projecting cornice surrounding the building on all sides except the back facade.

The church's front facade has three bays. The central bay is distinguished by its pedimented gable, its parapet, and by its three large (approximately 6' \times 15') triple-hung windows capped with hoods and separated by pilasters. Flanking the central bay are raised entranceways. The east, west and north windows have stained glass.

On the interior, the central bay of the building is open from the first floor to the second level ceiling. This massive open area is vaulted at the ceiling and supported by oak beams, girders and trusses. The rest of the interior space is accented with oak including the doors, columns, railings, trim and basement meeting room floor.

8. Significance



Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Congregational Church is significant in the areas of both architecture and religion. Still retaining many of its original features including its unadorned projecting cornice, decorative pilasters and large triple-hung windows with stained glass panels, the church is a fine example of Renaissance Revival architecture - a style seldom used for the design of ecclesiastical buildings in South Dakota.

The first church organized in Rapid City was the Congregational. Its history began in January of 1879 when the Rev. Bartlett became the church's first pastor. The first permanent building was constructed of frame in 1883, and, for many years, was distinguished as the only self-supporting church in the Black Hills. Built for a cost of \$20,500, the present brick Congregational Church replaced the original frame building in 1914.
