The house, originally an ell in plan, was made into a U by addition of a wing in 1923. Typical Taylor elements include the canted position of the entrance porch in the angle of the ell, groups of diamond paned windows, gable with returning eaves, half round window in the gable end, and stucco walls, here divided into horizontal, canted bands.

Taylor designed the original house, and also the alterations for a later owner. For the added gable, he used a gambrel roof, but with the half round window repeated from the earlier peaked gable end.
