

Confederate Monument Lincoln County, Kentucky

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**Description** The Confederate Monument in the Crab Orchard is a white marble obelisk approximately ten feet tall. The main shaft of the obelisk rests upon a short base approximately four feet high. This base is inscribed on four faces. Those faces read: south face "Here off duty till the last reveille the southern soldiers few in number who were slain in this and in adjoining counties during the war of secession. They fell among strangers unknown, unfriended, yet not unhonored for strangers hands have gathered their ashes here and placed this shaft above them. That constancy, valor sacrifice of self, though displaced in fruitless enterprise may not be unremembered;" east face: "Kentucky Tennessee;" north side: "Constantes Esque Ad Mortem Animas Perjecere;" west side: "Georgia Texas." Surrounding the shaft, which is on a mound, is a circle of thirty head stones that radiate out some 15 feet from the base of the shaft. The shaft is draped and there is a ball at the very top.

Statement of Significance The Confederate Monument in the Crab Orchard Cemetery meets National Register criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This monument was erected prior to 1880. It has all the trappings of an elaborate headstone. The shaft is draped as in mourning and the Latin inscription suggests life after death. There is no celebration or tribute here, this monument was strictly erected as a monument to the final resting place of Confederate soldiers. It is a good example of the property type "shaft or obelisk." It is also an excellent example of a monument erected as a monument to the dead.

**Verbal Boundary Description** - The Confederate Monument whose boundaries form a circle with a radius of 25 feet centered on the monument located in the Crab Orchard Cemetery.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.
