The Guettler House is located one block east of Cologne's business district within the Cologne Milling, Inc. complex. The house is 2½ stories in height and constructed of Chaska brick. It has a steeply pitched multi-gabled roof. The gable ends with pent roofs are decorated with fretwork, decorative shingles which surround horizontally placed rectangular windows, and fascia boards which are divided into rectangular panels. The eaveline is bracketted at spaced intervals. The one over one double hung windows are deeply recessed and capped by vertically laid brick "jack arches." The only alteration to the building since its construction in 1902 is the removal of the front entry portico. The house, adapted to offices, retains a significant degree of design integrity and is in a good state of preservation. Significance: The Guettler House, built in 1902, is significant for its historic association with the earliest, largest, and longest continuously operating industry in Cologne. In addition, it is a significant architectural element in the town. In 1880, George Guettler and other Cologne residents founded the first industry in the newly established town. His son, Philip Guettler, Sr., became sole owner of the mill in 1925 and continued his active interest until the firm's incorporation in 1947. Since 1947, the third generation of the Guettler family has operated the mill. Since its founding, the mill has undergone extensive changes and diversification. The original mill and elevator have since disappeared. Despite this fact, Cologne Milling, Inc. remains the largest feed mill and elevator complex in Carver County.
