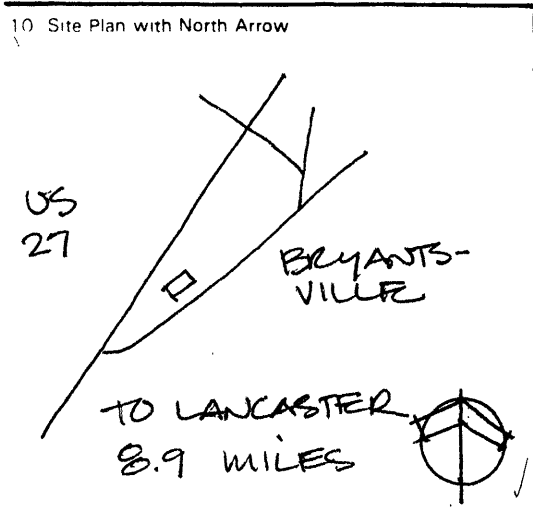

 In the year 1857, I.M. Myers deeded this land for a church. Whether this church was already in existence as a organization, coming from some older organization, is not definetely known. There are good grounds for believing that it was. This building was located on a lot next to the old Tillet house. During the Civil War it was used as a hospital for some of the soldiers, after the battle of Perryville. The old frame building was replaced in 1919 & 1920 by the new brick church.

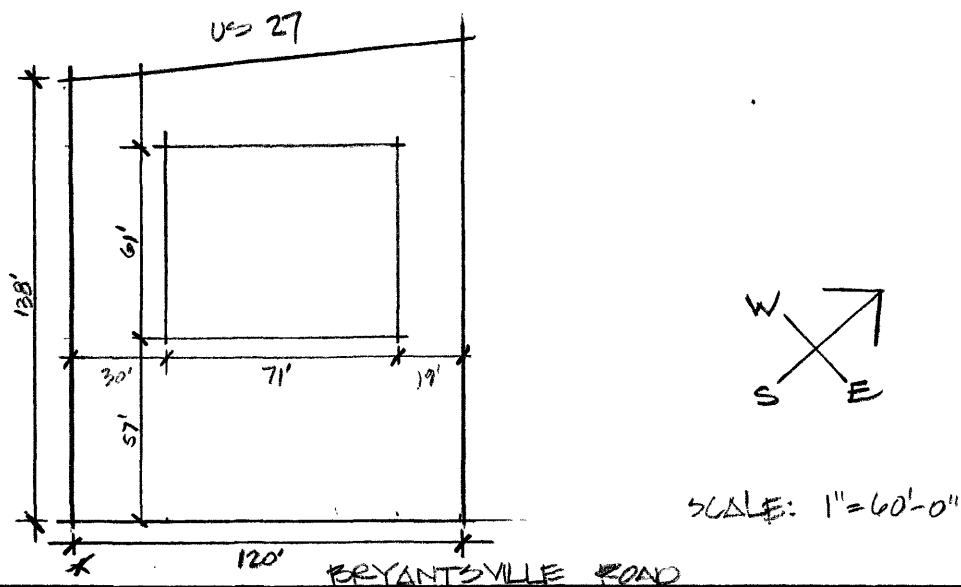

Verbal Boundary Description Acreage .38

From a point in the west right of way of the Bryantsville Road; then northwest 138 feet to a point; then northeast 135 feet to a point; then southeast 145 feet to the west right of way of the Bryantsville Road; then with the west right of way 120 feet southwest to the point of beginning.

The point of beginning is 57 feet southeast and 30 feet southwest of the southeast corner of the Bryantsville Methodist Church.
