one w serpentine shelf, six panel doors, ash flooring. Kitchen ill on rear has 7 ft fireplace; 1st floor wing very early; passage between now enclosed; 2 sets enclosed stairs in interior wall each lead to upstairs bedrooms (now having connecting door); enclosed stair to attic. Double front and rear paneled doors, battered on interior. House remarkably original and unaltered.

House situated in very picturesque scene meadow on a knoll above the creek, surrounded by wooded cliffs and the sound of rushing water. The grounds have lovely boxwood formal gardens, a stone walled terrace, and stone steps and walkway down to the creek bank.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A where the drive crosses a branch at the road, thence with road 400 ft W to B below a waterfall at a rock fence, thence with rock fence N to the peak, thence E with the creek 550 ft to D, thence parallel to B-C S to E, at the road, thence with road W 100 ft to the beginning, containing the stone house and gardens, about 5 acres.
