14. History:

In 1818 James Allen purchased the northwest 30 square feet of in-lot 38, originally allotted to William Moore, on Court Street and Water Street; deeded by Allen to the Justice of the Court for the building of an office for the County and Circuit Court Clerks. Served as Clerk's Office until 1842. After the Vaughn family purchased Allen's Inn, in 1877, the building was the residence of a former Vaughan slave, Aunt Eunice. Building has been purchased and repaired by the City of Greensburg.

45. Description and House Plan:

One-story, two-bay, single-cell, dry-stone building, ca. 18 x 24 feet. Masonry of coursed limestone, stones tooled and squared; mortar joints square, raised. Exterior chimney in east gable end. Voussoirs without keystones above all openings. Frames beaded, pegged; applied ovolo trim, 9/6 sash, square corner sills. One door, one window north side, two windows south side. Stone steps with squared corners to entrance.

Interior retains original chair rail and window frames. Some plank flooring replaced; fireplace reopened and mantel (not original) re-installed. New cedar roofing. Erosion exposes some of east foundation.

Built endwise into side of hill descending from courthouse square to Goose Creek which runs through town; originally on Court Street which ran to Water Street, but lower Court Street is now a foot bridge to the top of the bank across the creek. Building is immediately across the alley from the east end of Allen's Inn (GN-G-13).

13. Statement of Significance (Continued)

This Clerk's Office and the courthouse (GN-G-15 - N.R.) in the same row are the only stone ones remaining in Kentucky.
