




The Mercer County Jailer's residence is a two-story, five bay structure. The windows have a stone lintel across the top. A central doorway opens onto a central passage plan which now has two rooms of unequal size. The original plan probably allowed for cells in front. The chimneys are on the gable ends and protrude slightly. Brick on the front facade is laid in a flemish bond. To the rear or west is a two story jail built in 1877. The jail block has under gone extensive modifications through the decades to comply with state regulations.

Statement of Significance

The Mercer County Jailer's residence is significant under Criterion C for the period from 1827 to 1833 as an example of how elements such as from the Federal style such as Flemish bond brickwork and elements from the Greek Revival style such as the flat lintels over the windows were combined on a double-pile central passage house.

Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary was chosen to follow the property lines of the lot historically associated with the jailer's house.

The nominated area contains one contributing building.
