DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hollywood Station is a reinforced concrete building with a flat asphalt composition roof. Ornament is restrained and is limited to fluting and floral patterns cast into the concrete. The combination of simplified forms with limited classical ornament identifies the building as an example of the Starved Classical style.

LOCAL CONTEXT

Hollywood is within the corporate boundaries of the City of Los Angeles, roughly six miles northwest of Downtown Los Angeles. The Hollywood Post Office is located a half block south of Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood's main commercial street. Surrounding uses are primarily one-and-two story mixed commercial and residential structures.

PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The front elevation is symmetrical, and consists of a central one-and-a-half story portion that projects forward from two single-story wings. The central portion consists of five large window openings separated by fluted piers. Round floral medallions are placed above each pier, and an elaborate high relief floral frieze encircles the central portion. The cornice is set back two steps, and ornamented by a series of thin, low relief shapes resembling a long row of blance-manges. The projecting wings are pierced with three window openings, surrounded by fluting resembling that on the central piers. The same floral frieze runs along the cornice of the side wings as in the central portion. The south elevation contains an entrance into the public lobby, and is decorated with fluting and friezes similar to the front elevation.

The building is reinforced concrete, with concrete "cast stone" ornament. The orginial bronze and glass doors and bronze light fixtures remain in place on the front entrance. The exterior walls are painted a light beige, and the cast ornament a dark chocolate brown.

The public lobby occupies the eastern portion of the building, with the service counters located on the west wall. The floor is paved with red, green, and yellow terrazzo, and has a fossiliferous limestone wainscoting and fluted marble pilasters. The workroom has a hardwood floor and plaster walls. The originial wrought iron registers were retained when HVAC improvements were made, though the originial lighting has been replaced with bare fluorescent bulbs. A relieft sculpture, carved in Phillippine Mahogany, is located on the north end of the lobby.

ALTERATIONS

An access ramp for the handicapped was added in the 1960s, and additional workroom spaces was added.

SCULPTURE

The lobby contains a mahogany relief panel, depicting a person holding the reigns of two horses. Local post office employees and patrons identify the iconographic content as a Pony Express rider. This explanation is doubtful, since the panel depicts a bucking horse with a heavy saddle and no mail bags, but no further information could be uncovered at the post office which would provide a more accurate identification.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Though the Hollywood Station is not yet 50 years old it possesses exceptional significance based on its importance to the Hollywood area, and as a rare, intact example of the Starved Classical. The additions to the workroom are the only significant exterior modifications, and are not visible from the street. The interior is likewise in an excellent state of preservation and is a good example of a Starved Classical interior.

ARCHITECTURE

The combination of the building's significance as an example of Starved Classicism in small, single purpose post offices and of the Treasury Relief Art Project sculpture in the lobby forms an exceptionally significant and distinguishable entity; an archetypal mid-1930s post office.

Though the Hollywood Station is not quite 50 years old, it possesses exceptional architectural significance for Hollywood, and California as a whole. The building is an almost archtypal example of Starved Classicism, and retains substantial intergrity of design, location, setting, feeling and association. The minor additions to the front elevation and the workroom addition have not impaired the structure's aesthetic integrity. The use of a central, raised entrance surrounded by two lowered wings was characteristic of post office construction throughout the first four decades of this century, and is found in strongly Beaux-Arts classical buildings as well as later Italianate and Starved Classical buildings. The Hollywood Station retains a greater debt to Beaux-Arts notions of classicism that most Starved Classical buildings, which had Art Decoderived ornament. In the present building, the ornament consists of fluting on the pilasters and a belt course decorated with acanthus patterns. Though Hollywood retains several Art Deco-inspired buildings, the post office is a unique classical building in modernist clothing, and thus possesses exceptional local architectural significance.

SCULPTURE

The Hollywood: Station contains a low-relief wood panel by Gordon Newell and Sherry Peticolos. The relief depicts and androgenous figure holding two horses, perhaps alluding to the Pony Express though no mail bags are represented. The style of the scupiture is consistent with the representational "social realist" of most federally-sponsored work in the 1930's. The panel was commissioned under the Treasury Relief Art Program, which also awarded the same two artists contracts for scupiture in the Colton, Inglewood, and San Fernando Post Offices. The artists are not included in standard art bibliographies.


