Exterior features include exposed log purlins and rafters. This shelter was built in the 1930s by the USFS using CCC labor. The CCCs were stationed down lake (Chelan) at 25-Mile Camp, but had a side camp (20 men) in Stehekin for many years. This shelter had new shakes installed on the roof and walls c. 1979-80.</pre>

SIGNIFICANCE Eligible under Nat. Reg. Criterion C: significant as a distinct type of building. This is a good example of a 1930s-era USFS-designed backcountry shelter. It reflects the USFS design ethic of utilizing natural/native materials and siting structures sensitively in their environments. Only a few regulation(designed and built according to USFS standards) abolters stand today with NOCA: most were removed by the USFS and NPS because of changing needs. This shelter possesses
