The Happy Valley School is a one-story brick, rectangular plan, three bay brick building with Colonial Revival influences. The building has a concrete foundation, gable roof of original pressed metal shingles and stretcher bond brick exterior. On the main (south) facade is a one story portico with square Doric columns, pilasters and railing with square balusters. Windows on the main facade are six-over-six and nine-over-nine sash. The main entrance has multi-light glass and frame doors. At the rear is also a brick chimney. The interior is composed of one large room and several smaller rooms with original five panel doors and transoms and tongue in groove wainscoting. No interior photographs were possible. At the rear is a ca. 1970 woodshed with lattice walls and a shed roof. The school is located in a largely rural area in Happy Valley adjacent to Chilhowee Mountain.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Happy Valley School is significant under criterion A as an example of an early 20th century public school facility in the rural areas of the county. The school is representative of a period of construction by the Blount County School Board which resulted in the replacement of earlier frame school buildings with modern brick facilities. The Happy Valley School has not been altered and is the most intact example of a rural school of this type in the county. The majority of other rural school buildings have been razed or altered and the Happy Valley School is the only extant rural school to retain its original form and design.

This property was deeded to the School Directors of Blount County in 1883 by Absalom Boring and his wife Nancy Boring. The one acre lot was deeded for the construction of a school by the Borings whose deed stated "for the love we have for education". It is not known if a school was built immediately after but there is a record of a school built on this site in 1908. This frame schoolhouse served the community of Happy Valley for many years until it was replaced ca. 1936 by the present brick structure. This brick school was designed with Colonial Revival influences and was the primary school for the valley until consolidation in the 1970s. The property was deeded to the present owners by the school board in 1980.


