DESCRIPTION

ARCHITECTURAL STYLE Italian Villa

DATE c. 1860

FORM 2 stories; front-gable L-plan main block with three-stage square entrance tower in re-entrant angle; two-story, hipped-roofed additions on north (rear) and west, with 1-story little room in northwest re-entrant angle

MATERIALS frame construction on rockfaced stone foundation; narrow clapboards on side and rear elevations; front elevation faced with wide, beveled plank siding with mitred corners

FENESTRATION main block: 6/6 d.h.s. on sides; front has two round-arched windows at each story, the lower ones taller than those above, with wooden muntins; west rear wing has paired 1/1 sash below shared transoms with leaded "bull's-eye" glass at second story level, with a triple sash window set within an elliptical arch at first floor level; north wing has 1/1 d.h.s., also some stained glass edging a fixed-sash window at first story; 1-story oriel at main floor level on east side has bull's-eye glass transom above plate glass window FEATURES (see fenestration); bracketted cornice on main block and west wing; entrance porch has spindle frieze, wrought-iron deck railing; just above ground level on front (opened into basement wall) are two large circular windows

ALTERATIONS third stage of tower reworked; new steps and platform for main entrance porch; original main entrance partly sealed off, with narrower door; fenestration in west wing appears to be turn of the century, suggesting this wing may have been added after original construction

SITE large, shaded lot well above street level; house set well back; circular brick walk, possibly early 1900's, in front of house

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE This is one of a limited number of gabled Villa-style houses recorded in the Davenport survey. Noteworthy features include some fine windows; porch roof cresting; porch millwork; and the very curious large round windows in the basement (which appear to be, although not fully confirmed, original). Of interest, too, is the way the main, "public" facade is covered with matched, beveled siding, as though to suggest ashlar (CON'T)

Available published evidence indicates a HISTORICAL DATA construction date perhaps as early as 1858; it may be that additional research plus a more detailed physical investigation of the house could reveal either a later date, or perhaps additions to an original structure. According to currently known information, the house was built for Thomas C. Wilkinson for his retirement. Wilkinson came to Davenport in 1854 after 10 years as a bricklayer in St. Louis. He settled on "Rose Hill Farm" with his wife, Ellen McManus Atkinson, daughter of Judge James McManus who lived on a farmstead to the east. Thomas Wilkinson committed suicide at the house on Christmas Eve, 1876.


