Art Deco: Uneven roofline, lavish decorative motifs used such as eagles in a band across the facade and on rear wings with the shield of the United States; inset windows with grillwork; foliated and geometric motifs; interior retains much of its original appearance with Art Deco inspired furnishings including decorated elevators, grillwork, railings, and ceiling and floor treatments.

Although this building does not meet the fifty year minimum age requirement, it is important architecturally and is Hunt's most significant Art Deco design in Chattanooga. It is also Hunt's last major design in Chattanooga.
